- 2. Five (5) of the class members had attended a prior program.
- 3. All nine (9) persons attended a minimum of three (3) sessions of the program; they will all be included in the follow up.
- 4. There were several people with major health concerns.
- 5. The first night of the program, a gentleman attended who seemed unable to process what was required or taking place. Later it seemed he had signed on for a different program.

Mar. 30 - May 4, 2017

- 1. Everyone involved with running or setting up the program continues to be amazingly supportive.
- 2. Two (2) of the class members had attended a prior program.
- 3. Six (6) persons attended a minimum of three (3) sessions of the program; they will all be included in the follow up.
- 4. There were two people with mental health concerns.
- 5. One person was an employee at the University of Maryland Upper Chesapeake Health Center.

Sept.14 - Oct. 19, 2017

- 1. Everyone involved with running or setting up the program continues to be amazingly supportive.
- 2. Three (3) of the class members had attended a prior program.
- 3. Eight (8) people attended a minimum of three (3) sessions of the program; they will all be included in the follow up.
- 4. One gentleman brought along his wife as support. She was not included in any of the tallies.
- 5. There was one person with mental health concerns.
- 6. No one was employed by University of MD Upper Chesapeake Health.
- 7. Whenever there is a change (e.g., a room change, inclement weather, an illness causing someone to miss a session, or a change in work hours), attendance will delcine. In this program all occurred.

Oct. 16- Dec. 7, 2017

- 1. Everyone involved with running or setting up the program continues to be amazingly supportive.
- 2. Three (3) of the class members had attended a prior program. They continued through the program, as they all felt the need for support; and they were inspirational to the other class attendees.
- 3. There were three brothers who attended. One of them also brought his wife. When the brothers chose to stop attending classes, it made it very hard for the wife to quit too. She ended up cutting back a lot, but not quitting completely.
- 4. Ten (10) people attended a minimum of three (3) sesssions of the program; they will all be included in the follow up.
- 5. There were three (3) people with behavioral health concerns.
- 6. There were two people who were employed by University of Maryland Upper Chesapeake Health. They both succeeded in quitting.
- 7. Whenever there is inclement weather, a holiday, an illness causing someone to miss a session, or a change in work hours, attendance will decline. In this program, all of those occurred.
