Jan. 11- Feb. 13, 2018

1. Everyone involved with running or setting up the program continues to be amazingly supportive.

2. The Kaufman Cancer was forced to move all of their education programs offsite, due to flu precations. We moved to the Bel Air Library. The program

then had to change nights from Thursday to Tuesday for several of the sessions. Regretably, there were no other locations available on Thursday evenings. Four (4) of the class members had a prior program.

4. There were two people who attended for only one session, so they could receive Vouchers (one for patches, the other for lozenges). They are not counted in the number of people to follow up, as they only came for one session.

6. Three people had quit by the fifth (final) week of the program; a fourth person quit the following day, and now has gone for three days without tobacco. She surprised herself and is quite proud of her admittedly brief success.

One of the participants was hospitalized during the program, and did succeed in quitting.
